
HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY TO REVIEW ITS EFFORTS
OF PROVIDING REENTRY SERVICES TO ALL INMATES RELEASED FROM
CUSTODY.

1 WHEREAS, several bills have been introduced during the 2009
2 Regular Session relating to the provision of reentry services by
3 the Department of Public Safety to furloughed inmates, including
4 the reorganization and establishment of a new reentry services
5 division that would combine the services provided by the present
6 intake service centers with services provided to furloughed
7 inmates to assist their reentry into the community; and

8
9 WHEREAS, the Department of Public Safety has testified in
10 opposition to these measures, citing the fact that intake
11 services and reentry services are dissimilar, having different
12 basic functions and missions in the correctional field; and

13
14 WHEREAS, with recidivism rates that range from forty-seven
15 per cent to as high as ninety per cent, depending upon whether
16 the inmate was incarcerated locally or on the mainland, it is of
17 vital importance to the health, safety, and welfare of the
18 community that all efforts be undertaken to ensure the
19 successful reentry of inmates into the community; and

21 WHEREAS, the Department of Public Safety has provided
22 testimony that it is currently undergoing internal
23 reorganization efforts specifically designed to streamline and
24 consolidate operations to more efficiently perform its core
25 functions of correctional and inmate management and
26 classification; now, therefore,

28 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the
29 Twenty-fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session
30 of 2009, the Senate concurring, that the Department of Public



1 Safety is requested to review its efforts of providing reentry
2 services to all inmates released from custody by considering:

- 4 (1) Renaming the Intake Service Centers Division as the
5 Intake and Reentry Division to fulfill the objectives
6 of the Department's Reentry Plan by ensuring a
7 continuum of services from correctional facilities to
8 the community;
- 9
- 10 (2) Consolidating within the new Intake and Reentry
11 Division, the functions of the Intake Service Centers
12 and all reentry services provided by the furlough
13 programs in each county preparing inmates for release
14 and reentry into the community;

- 16 (3) Utilizing the four reentry worker positions that were
17 established in the Intake Service Centers by the 2007
18 Regular Session of the Legislature, to enable the new
19 Intake and Reentry Division to provide case management
20 for the Department's reentry process, provided that
21 positions do not include the security staff associated
22 with the furlough programs, any services under the
23 Corrections Program Services Division, such as
24 education, library, food services, and substance abuse
25 treatment, and volunteer services; and

- 27 (4) Authorizing the Intake and Reentry Division to work
28 closely and collaborate with the furlough programs of
29 each county under the jurisdiction of the Institution
30 Division, the Corrections Program Services Division,
31 Correctional Industries, the Hawaii Paroling
32 Authority, the Adult Client Services Branch of the
33 Judiciary, the Department of Health, Adult Mental
34 Health Division, and county and community partners;

37 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Public Safety
38 is requested to submit a report of its findings and
39 recommendations on the internal reorganization and creation of
40 the proposed Intake and Reentry Division, including any proposed
41 legislation, to the Legislature not later than twenty days prior
42 to the convening of the 2010 Regular Session; and

8 Services Branch of the Judiciary.
