
HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

RECOGNIZING THE IMPORTANCE OF BICYCLING.

1 WHEREAS, bicycling can provide multiple and cross-cutting
2 benefits in policy initiatives that seek to address
3 transportation needs, limit climate change and energy
4 consumption, and improve public health; and

5
6 WHEREAS, bicycle commuters help reduce traffic by leaving
7 automobiles at home, thus also saving on fuel costs, vehicle
8 maintenance, and parking expenses; and

9
10 WHEREAS, the State of Hawaii is home to nearly 1,300,000
11 people; and

12
13 WHEREAS, in 2007 there were 1,167,240 registered vehicles
14 in the State, where the number of motor vehicles nearly equals
15 the number of residents in the State; and

16
17 WHEREAS, the rising demand for energy in the global economy
18 strains the world's dwindling natural resources and contributes
19 to the increase of harmful environmental pollutants; and

20
21 WHEREAS, the bicycle, as transportation equipment, creates
22 zero emissions driven by efficient and abundant human power; and

23
24 WHEREAS, 35.1 per cent of the State's population is
25 considered overweight; and

26
27 WHEREAS, riding a bicycle is an easy way to incorporate
28 cardiovascular exercise into an active lifestyle, especially for
29 senior citizens; and

1 WHEREAS, a bicycle allows children to be "free range" and
2 provides for independence for people too young to drive; and
3

4 WHEREAS, the National Governors Association states that
5 "walking and biking are fundamental for transportation and
6 recreation. There can be no compromise on this issue."; and

8 WHEREAS, the people of Hawaii have shown their support for,
9 through polls and initiatives, riding bicycles, showing an
10 awareness and appreciation for bicyclists, and sharing the
11 streets with the automobile's two-wheeled counterpart; now,
12 therefore,
13

14 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the
15 Twenty-fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session
16 of 2009, the Senate concurring, that Hawaii residents are
17 encouraged to ride bicycles for transportation as well as
18 recreation; and

20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of
21 Transportation is urged to embrace "Complete Street" policies
22 that acknowledge the contributions of bicycles as a means to
23 reduce vehicle miles by integrating bicycle use into standard
24 street design; and

26 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
27 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Health,
28 the Director of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism, the
29 Director of Transportation Services of the City and County of
30 Honolulu, the directors of the agencies responsible for public
31 works for the respective counties of Kauai, Maui, and Hawaii,
32 the Chairperson of the University of Hawaii's Department of
33 Urban and Regional Planning, and to the Director of
34 Transportation, who in turn is requested to transmit copies to
35 the Chairperson of the Hawaii State Transportation Commission,
36 the Chairperson of the Highway Safety Council, the Chairperson
37 of the Strategic Highway Safety Plan Steering Committee, the
38 Chairperson of the Hawaii Energy Policy Forum, the Chairperson
39 of the Greenhouse Gas Emissions Reduction Task Force, the
40 President of the Institute of Transportation Engineers, Hawaii
41 Section, the President of the Maui Bicycle Alliance, the
