HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING STATE AND LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS TO ABIDE BY STATE LAWS RELATING TO THE MEDICAL USE OF MARIJUANA.

WHEREAS, the legislative intent of Act 228, Session Laws of 1 2000, was to ensure that seriously ill people are not penalized 2 by the State for the medical use of marijuana; and 3 4 WHEREAS, Act 228, which is codified in part IX of chapter 5 329, Hawaii Revised Statutes, permits qualified patients to use 6 marijuana for strictly medical purposes when the patient's 7 treating physician provides a professional opinion that the 8 benefits of the medical use of marijuana would likely outweigh 9 the health risks for the qualifying patient; and 10 11 WHEREAS, section 329-122, Hawaii Revised Statutes, permits 12 qualifying patients and their primary caregivers to jointly 13 possess an amount of marijuana that is not more than is 14 reasonably necessary to assure the uninterrupted availability of 15 marijuana for the purpose of alleviating the symptoms or effects 16 of a qualifying patient's debilitating medical condition, 17 provided that this amount does not exceed three mature marijuana 18 plants, four immature marijuana plants, and one ounce of usable 19 marijuana per each mature plant; and 20 21 22 WHEREAS, it is often difficult for qualifying patients to acquire and cultivate marijuana for medical use; 23 24 25 WHEREAS, since the enactment of Act 228, state and local law enforcement agencies have authorized and conducted searches 26 of qualifying patients' property and seized supplies of medical 27 marijuana that state law permits qualifying patients to possess 28 29 and use; now, therefore, 30 31 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the

Twenty-fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2009, that state and local law enforcement officers are requested to abide by state laws regarding the medical use of marijuana; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, the Director of Public Safety, the state Attorney General, and the police departments of the counties of Oahu, Maui, Kauai, and Hawaii.
