## HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING CONGRESS TO ENACT NECESSARY LEGISLATION TO ALLOW  
QUALIFIED PATIENTS TO TRANSPORT MEDICAL MARIJUANA AND  
PARAPHERNALIA FOR PERSONAL USE WHEN TRAVELING INTERSTATE.

1           WHEREAS, part IX of chapter 329, Hawaii Revised Statutes,  
2 permits qualifying patients to obtain written certification for  
3 the medical use of marijuana; and  
4

5           WHEREAS, such certification permits qualifying patients to  
6 acquire, possess, cultivate, use, distribute, or transport  
7 marijuana for personal use to alleviate symptoms or effects of  
8 debilitating medical conditions; and  
9

10          WHEREAS, Hawaii's qualifying patients who wish to travel to  
11 destinations within the United States are typically required to  
12 travel by air; and  
13

14          WHEREAS, qualifying patients traveling by air must be  
15 screened by federal Transportation Safety Administration (TSA)  
16 security officers; and

18          WHEREAS, since medical use of marijuana is not recognized  
19 under federal law, TSA screening may lead to the confiscation of  
20 medical marijuana and the arrest of qualifying patients; now,  
21 therefore,

23          BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the  
24 Twenty-fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session  
25 of 2009, that the United States Congress is requested to enact  
26 necessary legislation to allow qualified patients to transport  
27 medical marijuana and paraphernalia for personal use when  
28 traveling interstate; and

30          BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this  
31 Resolution be transmitted to the President of the United States
