A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE ECONOMY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

| 1 | SECTION 1. Section 201-19, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is |
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| 2 | amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows: |
| 3 | "(b) The department shall submit to the legislature no |
| 4 | later than twenty days prior to the convening of each regular |
| 5 | legislative session, a [written performance report on the impact |
| 6 | of activities of the department and attached agencies that |
| 7 | demonstrate their efforts to support, promote, and facilitate |
| 8 | the expansion and long-term viability of emerging growth |
| 9 | industries including those identified in subsection (a) (1). |
| 10 | report that provides an update on the criteria used to measure |
| 11 | growth of these emerging industries. In updating its reports on |
| 12 | growth of emerging industries each year, the department shall |
| 13 | develop updated measurements and analyses in collaboration with |
| 14 | the University of Hawaii, county economic development boards and |
| 15 | private, non-profit economic research activities." |
