SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE GOVERNOR AND THE CHAIRPERSON OF THE BOARD OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES TO STRIVE TO EXPEND THE STATE OF HAWAII'S FULL ALLOTMENT OF FEDERAL AID IN WILDLIFE RESTORATION FUNDS.

1 WHEREAS, the Federal Aid in Wildlife Restoration Act of
2 September 2, 1937, provides federal aid to states for management
3 and restoration of wildlife; and
4

5 WHEREAS, funds from an eleven per cent excise tax on
6 sporting arms and ammunition are appropriated to the Secretary
7 of the Interior and apportioned to states on a formula basis for
8 paying up to seventy-five per cent of the cost approved projects
9 including acquisition and improvement of wildlife habitat,
10 introduction of wildlife into suitable habitat, research into
11 wildlife problems, surveys and inventories of wildlife problems,
12 acquisition and development of access facilities for public use,
13 and hunter education programs, including construction and
14 operation of public target ranges; and

16 WHEREAS, state matching funds are available through in-kind
17 service projects and other means; and
18

19 WHEREAS, each year, the State of Hawaii does not use its
20 full allotment of federal funding resulting in the unused funds
21 being returned to the federal government for other purposes; and

23 WHEREAS, there are many potential projects in the State of
24 Hawaii that qualify for use of the federal funds; and

26 WHEREAS, the development of a public target range on the
27 island of Hawaii has wide-ranging community support and is
28 needed; and

1 WHEREAS, using the federal funds allotted to the State of
2 Hawaii would be a needed economic boost for the State; now,
3 therefore,
4

5 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fifth
6 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2009, the
7 House of Representatives concurring, that the Legislature
8 requests the Governor and the Chairperson of the Board of Land
9 and Natural Resources to strive to expend the full allotment of
10 Federal Aid in Wildlife Restoration Act funds; and

12 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairperson of the Board of
13 Land and Natural Resources is requested to consider the
14 development of a shooting range on the island of Hawaii; and
15

16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairperson of the Board of
17 Land and Natural Resources submit a report of the use of the
18 Federal Aid in Wildlife Restoration Act funds to the Legislature
19 not later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular
20 Session of 2010; and

22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
23 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor and the
24 Chairperson of the Board of Land and Natural Resources.
