SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

STRONGLY URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES AND THE CITY OF HONOLULU TO HONOR ACT 15 OF THE 1921 TERRITORIAL LEGISLATURE BY PRESERVING THE WAIKIKI WAR MEMORIAL NATATORIUM IN IT'S ORIGINAL LOCATION ON THE WAIKIKI SHORE.

1 WHEREAS, the Twenty-Fifth Legislature finds that in
2 upholding the legislation passed by our forefathers, this body
3 perpetuates the integrity of the Hawaii State Legislature and
4 further ensures that the laws passed today are protected and
5 upheld by those elected to precede this Legislature; and
6

7 WHEREAS, in 1921, the Territorial Legislature of Hawaii
8 passed Act 15 which approved the construction of the Waikiki War
9 Memorial Natatorium, a "Living Memorial" to honor the 102
10 servicemen from Hawaii who were killed during World War I; and
11

12 WHEREAS, completed in 1927, the Waikiki War Memorial
13 Natatorium located in close proximity to Diamond Head, across
14 from Kapiolani Park, and situated between San Souci Beach and
15 the Waikiki Aquarium; and
16

17 WHEREAS, designed by famed architect Louis P. Hobart, the
18 façade features a Beaux-Arts style ornamental arched entryway
19 featuring four stone eagles measuring over twenty feet tall; and
20

21 WHEREAS, the actual Memorial is a 100 by 40-meter tide fed
22 saltwater pool where Buster Crabbe and Johnny Weismuller trained
23 for the 1928 Olympics and has also been host to world-renowned
24 national and international swim competitions, featuring figures
25 such as Duke Kahanamoku, Bill Smith, Ford Konno, coach Soichi
26 Sakamoto and more; and

28 WHEREAS, although the Waikiki War Memorial Natatorium has
29 deteriorated since its initial construction, in 2001, over four
30 million dollars of repairs were completed on the site including



1 a façade restoration and the renovation of the bleachers and
2 public restrooms; and

3
4 WHEREAS, the Waikiki War Memorial Natatorium is listed on
5 both the National and Hawaii Registers of Historic Places, is
6 not only an architectural anchor for the Waikiki District, but
7 the repository of Hawaii's swimming, ocean sports and Olympic
8 history; and

9
10 WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of this State to
11 preserve Hawaii's uniqueness and cultural identity for the
12 benefit of all its residents as well as its visitors; and

13
14 WHEREAS, the National Trust for Historic Preservation has
15 proven that Cultural Heritage Tourists are overall more
16 affluent, stay longer and spend more while contributing to
17 global understanding through cultural exchange and commerce; and

18
19 WHEREAS, cultural and heritage visitors spend, on average,
20 \$623 per trip compared to \$457 for all U.S. travelers, excluding
21 the cost of transportation; and

22
23 WHEREAS, heritage tourism and more broadly, historic
24 preservation and the efforts of the Heritage Caucus not only
25 benefits the State socially but economically as well; now,
26 therefore,

27
28 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-Fifth
29 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2009, the
30 House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of Land
31 and Natural Resources and the City and County of Honolulu honor
32 Act 15 of the 1921 Territorial Legislature by preserving the
33 Waikiki War Memorial Natatorium in it's original location on the
34 Waikiki shore; and

36 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
37 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the
38 Department of Land and Natural Resources, the Mayor of the City
39 and County of Honolulu, and the Honolulu City Council.
