
SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

PROCLAIMING 2009 AS THE YEAR OF THE NONCOMMISSIONED OFFICER
CORPS OF THE UNITED STATES ARMY.

1 WHEREAS, the United States Army's professional
2 Noncommissioned Officer Corps has a proud history and has
3 distinguished itself throughout the world as the backbone of the
4 Army by leading the way with two tasks in mind: obeying the
5 orders of the Corps' superior officers to accomplish the
6 mission, and looking out for the welfare of the Corps' soldiers;

9 WHEREAS, noncommissioned officers in the Noncommissioned
10 Officer Corps occupy a position of respect and leadership, and
11 have performed fundamental tasks such as serving as small unit
12 leaders, technical experts, trainers, and perhaps most
13 importantly, as guardians of the Army's standards; and

15 WHEREAS, the United States Army depends on the knowledge
16 and timeless qualities of leadership and courage that these
17 dedicated men and women possess, assigning them to lead the
18 charge from the front on today's battlefields in Operation Iraqi
19 Freedom, Operation Enduring Freedom in Afghanistan and the
20 Philippines, and in other locations throughout the world; and

22 WHEREAS, noncommissioned officers and their families have
23 made daily sacrifices and exemplified courage and a deep sense
24 of patriotism in their commitment to provide continual and
25 invaluable service to our State and to this great nation, and
26 have demonstrated their dedication and willingness to sacrifice
27 on behalf of their fellow Americans; and

29 WHEREAS, the Noncommissioned Officer Corps of the United
30 States Army has faced danger, endured hardships, and made the
31 ultimate sacrifice to defend our nation's freedoms; now,

1 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fifth
2 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2009, the
3 House of Representatives concurring, that the Legislature urges
4 the Governor to proclaim 2009 as the Year of the Noncommissioned
5 Officer Corps of the United States Army; and

8 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, Secretary
9 of the Army, Chief of Staff of the United States Army, Commander

13 Hawaii's congressional delegation.
