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## SENATE RESOLUTION

URGING THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF THE INTERIOR TO PLACE IOLANI PALACE ON THE NOMINATION LIST TO THE UNITED NATIONS EDUCATIONAL, SCIENTIFIC AND CULTURAL ORGANIZATION FOR WORLD HERITAGE SITE DESIGNATION.

1           WHEREAS, over 125 years ago, King Kalakaua ruled over an  
2 independent Hawaiian nation that was recognized internationally  
3 and had established over 90 legations and consulates in multiple  
4 seaports and cities of foreign countries; and

5  
6           WHEREAS, part of King Kalakaua's vision was the  
7 construction of Iolani Palace as a showcase for the  
8 sophistication and technological advancement of Hawaii as a  
9 society; and

10  
11           WHEREAS, following the overthrow of Queen Liliuokalani in  
12 1893, Iolani Palace ceased to be a royal palace and became the  
13 seat of government for five types of political administrations:  
14 provisional, republic, territorial, military, and finally, a  
15 state; and

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17           WHEREAS, Iolani Palace was designated a National Historic  
18 Landmark in 1962; and

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20           WHEREAS, the Executive and Legislative branches of the  
21 State of Hawaii vacated Iolani Palace in 1969 and moved to the  
22 newly constructed State Capitol building, thus paving the way  
23 for The Friends of Iolani Palace to proceed with restoration;  
24 and

26           WHEREAS, over the next decade, The Friends of Iolani  
27 Palace, founded in 1966 by Liliuokalani Kawananaokoa Morris, who  
28 was a grand-niece of Queen Kapiolani, painstakingly worked to  
29 return Iolani Palace to its former grandeur as it appeared  
30 during the Kalakaua Dynasty; and



1 WHEREAS, in 1978, Iolani Palace reopened to the public with  
2 the mission of perpetuating the Hawaiian monarchy and providing  
3 both visitors and residents with a fresh understanding of  
4 Hawaii's royal heritage; and  
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6 WHEREAS, when the current United States (U.S.) list of  
7 candidate sites was compiled for consideration as World Heritage  
8 Sites with the United Nations Educational, Scientific and  
9 Cultural Organization (UNESCO), Iolani Palace was not invited by  
10 the National Park Service to apply; and  
11

12 WHEREAS, due to the unique cultural and historical  
13 attributes of Iolani Palace and the underrepresentation of World  
14 Heritage sites in Oceania, The Friends of Iolani Palace believes  
15 that Iolani Palace meets multiple criteria for selection to  
16 become the very first man-made structure in Polynesia to be  
17 designated a World Heritage Site; and  
18

19 WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of The Friends of Iolani  
20 Palace unanimously passed a motion to actively pursue a  
21 nomination to become a UNESCO World Heritage Site at its  
22 regularly scheduled meeting on October 25, 2007; now, therefore,  
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24 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fifth  
25 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2009,  
26 that the Department of the Interior is requested to reopen the  
27 World Heritage nomination process that had been closed under the  
28 previous administration; and

30 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of the Interior  
31 is requested to include Iolani Palace on the current U.S.  
32 Tentative List and subsequently to be placed in the nomination  
33 file that will be presented to UNESCO's World Heritage Centre  
34 for review; and  
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
36 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Hawaii's Congressional  
37 Delegation urge the Department of the Interior to place Iolani  
38 Palace on the nomination list to UNESCO for World Heritage Site  
39 designation; and



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1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this  
2 Resolution be transmitted to the President of the U.S., U.S.  
3 Secretary of the Interior, and each member of Hawaii's  
4 Congressional Delegation.
