SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEVELOPMENT OF A PLAN FOR A STATE ORGANIC PROGRAM TO UNIFY THE STATE'S ORGANIC CERTIFICATION PRACTICES AND PROGRAMS.

1 WHEREAS, there are several organic certification agents 2 operating in the State who have been reported to interpret the rules of the National Organic Program of the United States 3 Department of Agriculture differently; and 4 5 WHEREAS, no statewide system for collecting data on organic 6 farms and small farms exists; and 7 8 9 WHEREAS, the general public does not have adequate information about what organic certification means; and 10 11 WHEREAS, it is suspected that some farmers self-declare 12 13 their products organic without pursuing the organic certification process, which leads to confusion for consumers; 14 15 and 16 WHEREAS, fifteen other states conduct organic certification 17 programs through their department of agriculture; and 18 19 WHEREAS, local conditions and considerations could be used 20 to bolster the National Organic Program rules and assist local 21 organic farmers; and 22 23 WHEREAS, more attention is needed for organic farming to 24 ensure its future success and integration into the larger 25 farming community both locally and nationwide; now, therefore, 26 27 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fifth 28 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2009, 29 that the Department of Agriculture is requested to develop a 30 plan for a State Organic Program to unify the State's organic 31 practices and programs by: 32 33 Providing consistent interpretation and application of 34 (1) National Organic Program rules; 35

1 2 (2) Actively collecting and disseminating information on organic farms in the State; 3 4 5 (3) Educating the general public about what organic certification means; 6 7 8 (4) Becoming a primary point of contact for the public reporting and the investigation of violations of the 9 National Organic Program; 10 11 (5) Providing local guidelines for and administering the 12 National Organic Program; and 13 14 (6) Establishing an Office for Organic Advocacy that would 15 16 be committed to building a reliable, safe, and responsive organic farming industry, including 17 coordinating other state agencies for organic farming 18 research and marketing; and 19 20 21 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Agriculture is requested to confer with the Hawaii Cooperative of Organic 22 Farmers, the Hawaii Organic Farmers Association, and the Hawaii 23 24 Farm Bureau Federation when preparing the plan; and 25 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 26 27 Resolution be transmitted to Chairperson of the Board of Agriculture, the President of the Board of Directors of the 28 Hawaii Cooperative of Organic Farmers, the Chairperson of the 29 30 Board of Directors of the Hawaii Organic Farmers Association, and the Executive Director of the Hawaii Farm Bureau Federation. 31 32 33 34 OFFERED BY:
