<u>HB 1070</u> Status	RELATING TO THE CODE OF FINANCIAL INSTITUTIONS. Amends and updates Hawaii's Code of Financial Institutions to address temporary office relocations and to place prudent limits on certain kinds of investments by financial institutions.	CPC
<u>HB 1075</u> Status	RELATING TO INSURANCE. Updates references in Article 10H of the Insurance Code governing long-term care insurance.	CPC
<u>HB 244</u> (HSCR345) Status	RELATING TO PUBLIC UTILITIES. Directs public utilities to establish discounted rates for providing services used for agricultural activities located in agricultural districts	AGR, CPC
<u>HB 591</u> (HSCR478) Status	RELATING TO PUBLIC UTILITIES. Authorizes a preferential rate for electricity purchased by electric utilities from renewable energy producers that are associated with agricultural activities.	EEP/AGR, CPC
<u>HB 1270, HD1</u> (HSCR299) Status	RELATING TO RENEWABLE ENERGY. Deletes avoided cost by a utility in determining a just and reasonable rate for nonfossil fuel generated electricity. (HB1270 HD1)	EEP, CPC
<u>HB 267, HD1</u> (HSCR394) Status	RELATING TO THE MOTOR VEHICLE RENTAL INDUSTRY. Allows the transportation of rental cars by any water carrier authorized to transport vehicles interisland by the State PUC; provided that the water carrier has a written contract with the owner of the rental car. RELATING TO APPRAISALS.  
Requires a real estate appraiser to comply with the Uniform Standards of Professional Appraisal Practice when acting as an appraiser or arbitrator in an arbitration to determine the value or rental of real estate.
