Status

RELATING TO LIQUOR LICENSES.

Extends the period of time, from 1 to 3 years, that an applicant who has been denied or refused a liquor license must wait before becoming eligible to submit another application for the same class of license at the same location.

Status

RELATING TO GENERAL EXCISE TAX.

Establishes an annual exemption from the general excise tax on the purchase of school supplies of less than \$50 per purchase and computers, computer software, and computer supplies of less than \$750 per purchase made between 12:01 A.M. on the last Friday in July and 11:59 P.M. the following Sunday.

Status

RELATING TO CONTRACTORS.

Excludes cost of materials in determining whether cost of project is less than \$1,000 for purposes of exemption from contractor licensing law.


