<u>SB 1065, SD2</u> <u>(SSCR750)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE NATURAL ENERGY LABORATORY OF HAWAII AUTHORITY. Exempts sales of electricity generated by NELHA from renewable energy sources from regulation by the public utilities commission when those sales are made to users located on adjacent property that is leased from the State. (SD2)	EEP/EBM, CPC
<u>SB 553, SD2</u> <u>(SSCR685)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO ENERGY-EFFICIENT LIGHTING. Requires use of compact fluorescent light bulbs, light-emitting diode lighting products, and advanced energy-efficient incandescent light bulbs in state buildings. (SD2)	EEP/EBM, FIN
<u>SB 555, SD2</u> <u>(SSCR617)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO ENERGY EFFICIENCY. Directs the DBEDT to investigate membership in the Multi-State Compliance Standard Collaborative and the Appliance Standard Awareness Project and report to the legislature. Directs DBEDT to make rules to enforce appliance efficiency standards. Prohibits the sale of appliances in the State after January 1, 2015, that do not meet efficiency standards. (SD2)	EEP/EBM, FIN




Testimony submitted will be placed on the Legislative Web site after the hearing adjourns. This public posting of testimony on the Web site should be considered when including personal information in your testimony.
