Status

RELATING TO ENERGY EFFICIENCY.
Establishes energy-efficiency initiatives necessary for and contributing to the transition of Hawaii's energy sector to non-petroleum energy sources. Effective 01/01/90. (SD2)

Status

RELATING TO ENERGY.
Requires maximum use of geothermal energy on the island of Hawaii to achieve energy self-sufficiency and reduce reliance on imported fossil fuels. Establishes a pilot program to facilitate the development of infrastructure for the deployment of renewable energy resources, including geothermal resources. (SD2)

Status

RELATING TO ENVIRONMENTAL RESPONSE.
Amends chapter 128D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to be consistent with federal law, which protects innocent purchasers of, and property owners who are contiguous to, contaminated property from liability for addressing contamination they did not cause. (SD2)

PAPER: 18 copies (including an original) to Room 317 in the State Capitol;


