<u>HB 430</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO ENERGY EFFICIENCY. Directs the public benefits fee administrator to review energy use patterns and develop an energy efficiency plan. Appropriates funds.	EEP, CPC, FIN
<u>HB 432</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO ENERGY EFFICIENCY. Expands the pay as you save pilot program to include photovoltaic energy systems and refrigerator exchanges.	EEP, CPC, FIN
<u>HB 433</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO ENERGY EFFICIENCY. Directs the public benefits fee administrator to develop and implement a program to encourage residential retail electricity customers to replace inefficient household appliances with ENERGY STAR appliances.	EEP, CPC, FIN
<u>HB 436</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO ENERGY EFFICIENCY. Directs the public utilities commission to establish a consumer information program on energy efficient properties.	EEP, CPC, FIN
