<a href="#">HB 36</a> <a href="#">Status</a>	RELATING TO HEALTH. Changes the name of the Environmental Health Education Fund to the Sanitation and Environmental Health Fund and allows the Fund to be used for sanitation program activities.	HLT, EEP, FIN
<a href="#">HB 1272</a> <a href="#">Status</a>	RELATING TO ELECTRONIC WASTE RECYCLING. Makes clarifying amendments to the electronic waste recycling act.	EEP, EBM
<a href="#">HB 1270</a> <a href="#">Status</a>	RELATING TO RENEWABLE ENERGY. Deletes avoided cost by a utility in determining a just and reasonable rate for nonfossil fuel generated electricity.	EEP, CPC
<a href="#">HB 1197</a> <a href="#">Status</a>	RELATING TO ALCOHOL FUELS. Improve Hawaii's economic and energy security position by establishing a preference for locally produced alcohol fuels.	EEP, FIN
<a href="#">HB 1491</a> <a href="#">Status</a>	RELATING TO ETHANOL FACILITY TAX CREDIT. Caps the total annual amount of ethanol facility tax credits allowed at \$8,000,000 between 01/01/09 to 12/31/12.	EEP, FIN
<a href="#">HB 1484</a> <a href="#">Status</a>	RELATING TO AIR POLLUTION FEES. Removes the exemption from fees for air pollution emissions in excess of 4,000 tons annually from covered sources.	EEP, FIN
<a href="#">HB 604</a> <a href="#">Status</a>	RELATING TO GRAY WATER. Requires county gray water recycling programs to conform to standards established by the department of health.	EEP, FIN

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<a href="#">HB 763</a> <a href="#">Status</a>	RELATING TO GRAY WATER RECYCLING. Requires the department of health to establish a gray water recycling program for premises not served by a county wastewater system. Permits counties to establish gray water recycling programs in areas served by a county wastewater system.	EEP, FIN
<a href="#">HB 1467</a> <a href="#">Status</a>	RELATING TO PROPERLY INFLATED TIRES. Requires retail service stations to provide free tire pressure gauges and operational tire inflation devices to enable motorists to maintain properly inflated tires so as to increase the overall operating efficiency of existing vehicles. Provides penalty.	EEP, CPC/JUD
<a href="#">HB 1417</a> <a href="#">Status</a>	RELATING TO MOBILE BILLBOARDS. Amends the restrictions on the use of mobile billboards and provides for penalties. Exempts businesses using advertising devices used in the daily function of the business.	EEP, JUD
