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HB 1293, HD1 (HSCR593) Status	RELATING TO LAW ENFORCEMENT Creates the Domestic Violence Special Fund to provide grants to organizations that provide domestic violence services. Provides grants to the counties for their career criminal prosecution units and victim witness assistance programs.	JUD, FIN
HB 1780, HD1 (HSCR594) Status	RELATING TO SENTENCING OF REPEAT OFFENDERS. Changes the mandatory minimum sentencing of repeat offenders from mandatory to discretionary	JUD, FIN
HB 1025, HD1 (HSCR378) Status	RELATING TO SENTENCING. Restores a statutory provision allowing for presentence mental health or medical examination of defendants for purposes of sentencing.	HUS, JUD, FIN
