<u>HB 1470</u> (HSCR407) Status	RELATING TO HAWAII PUBLIC PROCUREMENT CODE. Exempts GSA-approved sole source vendors on procurements involving federal matching funds from certain sole source procurement provisions.	EBM, FIN
<u>HB 1692, HD1</u> (HSCR43) Status	RELATING TO HOUSING. Restricts state low-income housing leases in certain cases, to no more than 5 years.	HSG, FIN
<u>HB 311</u> (HSCR96) Status	RELATING TO LIQUOR. Makes various administrative, technical amendments to the liquor license and liquor tax laws.	CPC/JUD, FIN
<u>HB 645, HD1</u> (HSCR167) Status	RELATING TO KAENA POINT. Establishes a pilot program to issue annual passes to Hawaii residents to fish overnight at Kaena Point State Park Reserve.	WLO, FIN
<u>HB 1693</u> (HSCR426) Status	RELATING TO WEST OAHU. Requires the Office of Planning to review the City & County of Honolulu's revised Ewa Development Plan to ensure the infrastructural needs of the rapidly developing area are adequately met.	WLO, FIN
<u>HB 899</u> (HSCR574) Status	RELATING TO THE OFFICE OF HAWAIIAN AFFAIRS. Clarifies and strengthens the Office of Hawaiian Affairs' bond authority.	HAW, FIN



<u>HB 1665</u> <u>(HSCR227)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO HAWAIIAN FISHPONDS. Prohibits the sale of public lands on which government-owned Hawaiian fishponds are located.	HAW, FIN
<u>HB 1666, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR576)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE HAWAIIAN LANGUAGE. Requires that all state and county letterheads, emblems, and symbols, when newly created, replaced, reprinted, or otherwise revised, contain the accurate, appropriate, and authentic Hawaiian names and language.	HAW, FIN
<u>HB 1015</u> <u>(HSCR575)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO OBLIGATIONS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF HAWAIIAN HOME LANDS TRUST FUND. Enables the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands to begin construction on affordable housing projects without having the full and final amount of the capital costs on hand at the beginning of the project.	HAW, FIN

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

PAPER: 2 copies (including an original) to Room 306 in the State Capitol;


