RESEARCH SPECIAL FUND.

Beginning 01/01/2010, requires the University of Hawaii to report semi-annually on the moneys in the Hawaii cancer research special fund, including deposits, expenditures, and other transactions.

SB 1674, SD2, HD1 (HSCR1126) Status

RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII.

Increases the amount of the revenue bond proceeds authorized by Act

161, Session Laws of Hawaii 2007 from \$100,000,000 to \$250,000,000, to address the capital facility needs of the University of Hawaii. Extends the lapse date of the appropriation of revenue bond proceeds authorized by Act 161 to June 30, 2013. Appropriates \$150,000,000 out of the revenue bond proceeds, to lapse on June 30,

2015.

SB 1665, SD2 (HSCR1248)

Status

RELATING TO HIGHER EDUCATION.

Enhances the workforce development capacity of Hawaii's community colleges by establishing a skilled worker and business development center to provide workforce training to meet the rapidly evolving needs of both employers and employees. Appropriates Reed Act funds.

RELATING TO AIRPORT CONCESSIONS.

Allows for certain adjustments and modifications to airport concession

leases. Effective 07/01/09.

SB 718, SD1 (HSCR1276) Status

RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION.

Requires the department of transportation and the county transportation departments to seek to reasonably accommodate access and mobility for all users of highways, roads, and streets, including pedestrians, bicyclists, transit users, motorists, and persons of all abilities. Establishes a temporary task force to review certain specified traffic policies and guidelines. Report to legislature in 2010 and 2011.

SB 1611, SD2. HD1 (HSCR1278) Status

RELATING TO HIGHWAYS.

Authorize the department of transportation to pursue a comprehensive six-year modernization program and provides it sufficient resources to implement the plan by amending the state liquid fuel tax, state vehicle registration fee, state vehicle weight fee, and rental motor vehicle surcharge through increases of the various taxes and the flat rate amount in sections 243-4(a), 249-31, 249-33(a), and 251-2(a), Hawaii Revised Statutes. Authorize the implementation of a Vehicle Miles Traveled Pilot Program.
