RELATING TO PUBLIC ACCOMMODATIONS.
Specifies state-operated schools, libraries, community colleges, and universities as examples of facilities that are places of public accommodation subject to anti-discriminatory prohibitions.

RELATING TO THE SCIENCE, TECHNOLOGY, ENGINEERING,
AND MATH INCOME TAX CREDIT.
Provides an income tax credit for donations made to a qualifying science, technology, engineering, and math academy certified by the department of business, economic development, and tourism.

HB 1217
Status

RELATING TO EDUCATION PROJECTS.
Appropriates \$100,000,000 in general obligation bond funds for public school projects and \$50,000,000 for University of Hawaii projects. Allows the appropriation to be used to match federal funds appropriated for state capital improvement projects under any federal fiscal stimulus legislation.

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW


Testimony submitted will be placed on the Legislative Web site after the hearing adjourns. This public posting of testimony on the Web site should be considered when including personal information in your testimony.
