<u>SB 848</u> <u>(HSCR1089)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO METAL. Removes sunset clause in Act 197, Session Laws of Hawaii 2007, which contains a repeal date of July 1, 2009.	CPC, JUD
<u>SB 942, SD1</u> <u>(HSCR1018)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO UNDERGROUND STORAGE TANKS. Ensure compliance with the federal Energy Policy Act of 2005. (SD1)	EEP, JUD
<u>SB 567, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR1117)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO HEALTH. Lowers the minimum age requirement for blood donation to sixteen years old with parental consent. Effective July 1, 2020. (SB567 HD1)	HLT, JUD
<u>SB 1130, SD2</u> <u>(HSCR1102)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE BUREAU OF CONVEYANCES. Requires the redaction of the first five digits of the social security numbers on judgments, decrees, and court orders when filing at the bureau of conveyances and land court. (SD2)	WLO, JUD
<u>SB 1241, SD2</u> <u>(HSCR1096)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO REAL PROPERTY TRANSACTIONS. Prohibits a deed restriction or covenant that requires a transferee of real property to pay a transfer fee to the person imposing the deed restriction or covenant, in connection with a transfer of real property. (SD2)	CPC, JUD



DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

- The date and time of the hearing;
- Measure number; and
- The number of copies the Committee is requesting.

While every effort will be made to copy, organize, and collate all testimony received, materials received on the day of the hearing or improperly identified or directed to the incorrect office, may be distributed to the Committee after the hearing.

PAPER: 1 (one) copies (including an original) to Room 302 in the State Capitol;


