RELATING TO OPIHI.
Establishes a five year moratorium on the harvesting of opihi on Oahu.
Establishes a ban on taking or harvesting opihi statewide, subject to
open and closed seasons and the traditional rights of certain ahupuaa
tenants. (SB1 HD1)

(HSCR1149)
Status

RELATING TO HIGH OCCUPANCY VEHICLE LANES.
Allows all motor vehicles, regardless of number of persons on board,
to use high occupancy vehicle lanes or zipper lanes when one or more
lanes of traffic have been shut down by law enforcement officers or
emergency services personnel. Allows the director of transportation to
declare an emergency to open use of HOV and zipper lanes. (SB714
HD1)

RELATING TO IDENTIFICATION.
Extends expiration period on the Hawaii State Identification card from
six years to eight years; deletes the provisions for transitioning from
expiration dates calculated by issue dates to expiration on the
cardholder's birthday.

Status

RELATING TO PUBLICITY RIGHTS.
Establishes property rights in the commercial use of a person's name
voice, signature, photograph, or likeness. (SB1005 HD1)

<u>SB 1056, SD2, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR1110)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO COMMERCIAL DRIVERS. Conforms penalty for violating an out-of-service order to federal regulation; provides penalty for operating a commercial motor vehicle with an alcohol concentration of an amount of 0.04 percent or more and imposes a penalty for operating a commercial motor vehicle with any amount of alcohol concentration. (SB1056 HD1)	TRN, JUD
<u>SB 979, SD2, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR1201)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO COMMERCIAL DRIVERS. Revises standard for a court-issued license to drive for work-related purposes. (SB979 HD1)	TRN, JUD
<u>SB 1183, SD2, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR1205)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO DISCRIMINATORY PRACTICES. Requires the Hawaii civil rights commission to define in administrative rules certain definitions for purposes of discriminatory employment practices. (SB1183 HD1)	LAB, JUD

<u>SB 1241, SD2</u> <u>(HSCR1096)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO REAL PROPERTY TRANSACTIONS. Prohibits a deed restriction or covenant that requires a transferee of real property to pay a transfer fee to the person imposing the deed restriction or covenant, in connection with a transfer of real property. (SD2)	CPC, JUD

- The number of copies the Committee is requesting.


