<u>Status</u> | RELATING TO GOVERNMENT RETENTION OF ATTORNEYS.
Authorizes the speaker of the house of representatives or the president of the senate, separately as well as jointly, to employ or retain attorneys. | LMG, JUD, FIN |
| <u>SB 1105, SD2</u>
(SSCR840)
<u>Status</u> | RELATING TO LEGISLATIVE HEARINGS AND PROCEDURES.
Requires any report of a study or an audit made by an executive department or agency, and by the legislative reference bureau, auditor, judiciary, or office of Hawaiian affairs, to be submitted to the clerk of each house, senate president, speaker of the house, chairs of the appropriate subject matter committee of each house, and the legislative reference bureau library. Requires a public hearing or informational briefing, except if waived by the senate president or speaker of the house of representatives. Excludes certain routine reports. (SD2) | LMG, FIN |
| <u>SB 1215</u>
(SSCR480)
<u>Status</u> | PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO THE HAWAII CONSTITUTION RELATED TO RESIDENCE REQUIREMENTS FOR MEMBERS OF THE LEGISLATURE.
Amends the state constitution to require candidates for the state senate or house of representatives to be a resident of the legislative district from which the person is a candidate for not less than twelve consecutive months prior to the general election. | LMG, JUD, FIN |
