Requires adjutant general, with the governor's concurrence, to select the nonprofit entity. Appropriates funds to the special fund. Takes effect July 1, 2020. When faxing, please indicate to which committee the testimony is being submitted and the date and time of the hearing.

**Please note: If you submit your written testimony after 4:00 p.m. the day prior to the hearing, please sign-in at the staff table to testify orally. A copy of your testimony may not be available during the hearing but will be posted online for the public after the hearing.**
