TRANSIENT ACCOMMODATIONS TAX.

TCI, FIN

<u>Status</u>

Repeals cap on deposit of transient accommodations tax (TAT) revenues into the convention center enterprise special fund. Increases percentage of TAT revenues to be deposited into the tourism special fund from 34.2% to 37.9%. Repeals deposit of excess revenues into

the general fund.

HB 756

RELATING TO THE GENERAL EXCISE TAX.

TCI, FIN

Status

Provides a general excise tax exemption for amounts received for the provision of facilities and services for convention, meeting, and incentive program events that are paid for by national and international

organizations.

HB 678 Status

RELATING TO THE HAWAII TOURISM AUTHORITY.

TCI, FIN

Requires Hawaii tourism authority to submit annual budget to legislature for approval. Requires expenditure caps on marketing, product development, and administration. Allows adjustment within each of the 3 categories, but not to exceed approved respective

maximum expenditure limits.

HB 682 Status

RELATING TO THE HAWAII TOURISM AUTHORITY.

TCI, FIN

Reduces the term of contracts, except for contracts for use of the convention center facility, the Hawaii tourism authority may enter into

from 5 to 2 years.

HB 684 Status

RELATING TO HAWAII TOURISM AUTHORITY.

TCI, FIN

Requires HTA budgetary controls in effect on January 1, 2008 to be made permanent. Allows changes to budgetary controls only with

legislative approval.

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RELATING TO THE HAWAII TOURISM AUTHORITY. TCI. FIN HB 754 Status Removes the directors of DBEDT and transportation, chairperson of the BLNR, and executive director of the state foundation on culture and the arts from the Hawaii tourism authority board. Requires members to be appointed by the mayors, senate president, and speaker of the house of representatives. Creates advisory group. RELATING TO THE HAWAII TOURISM AUTHORITY. TCI, FIN HB 755 Repeals sunset of provisions that allow the Hawaii tourism authority Status (HTA) to continue to: (1) hire its own attorneys; (2) exempt its accounts from comptroller's supervision; (3) use its own business and accounting forms; (4) use 5% of the tourism special fund for administration and appoint a sports coordinator; and (5) require the HTA to provide income and expenditure data to the comptroller.

RELATING TO THE HAWAII TOURISM AUTHORITY.

Broadens definition of "tourism emergency" and provides for plans and programs to address them.

HB 1472 RELATING TO THE HAWAII TOURISM AUTHORITY. TCI, LAB, FIN Status Make various amendments to clarify the Hawaii Tourism Authority
