Amends the authorized use of the passenger facility charge special fund to be used for bonds and establishes subaccounts within the special fund for airport capital improvement projects.	TIA, WAM

Authorizes the department of transportation to adopt rules relating to safety measures, security requirements, and shipping activities in commercial harbors controlled by the State.	TIA

Allows the department of transportation to impose upon private parties using state harbors and airports the duty to defend, hold harmless, and indemnify.	TIA, JGO
<a href="#"><u>SB 1224</u></a> <a href="#"><u>Testimony</u></a> <a href="#"><u>Status</u></a>	RELATING TO AIRPORT CONCESSIONS. Allows for certain adjustments and modifications to airport concession leases.	TIA, WAM
<a href="#"><u>SB 1064</u></a> <a href="#"><u>Testimony</u></a> <a href="#"><u>Status</u></a>	RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLE SAFETY. Prohibits the sale of new and unused tires that were manufactured more than six years prior to the date of the sale.	TIA, JGO

<a href="#"><u>SB 15</u></a> <a href="#"><u>Testimony</u></a> <a href="#"><u>Status</u></a>	RELATING TO THE POWER OF ARREST. Updates references to U.S. Customs and Border Protection Service and Citizenship and Immigration Services to reflect current names of agencies within the federal Department of Homeland Security. <a href="#"><u>SB 374</u></a> <a href="#"><u>Testimony</u></a> <a href="#"><u>Status</u></a>	RELATING TO INTOXICATING LIQUOR. Clarifies the prohibition on liquor labeling indicating an origin in Hawaii. Clarifies the authority of a licensed liquor manufacturer to sell liquor it manufactured on its premises; removes prohibition against the consumption of liquor on the premises of a licensed liquor manufacturer. Requires liquor licenses to carry liability insurance as a condition of acquiring and renewing a license. Requires liquor liability insurers to notify the county liquor commissions upon a termination, rejection, or nonrenewal of a licensee's coverage.	TIA, CPN
<a href="#"><u>SB 470</u></a> <a href="#"><u>Testimony</u></a> <a href="#"><u>Status</u></a>	RELATING TO LIQUOR. Makes various administrative, technical amendments to the liquor license and liquor tax laws.	TIA, CPN
<a href="#"><u>SB 1206</u></a> <a href="#"><u>Testimony</u></a> <a href="#"><u>Status</u></a>	RELATING TO COUNTIES. Specifies that in a county with a population of at least 500,000 people, a county board may issue revenue bonds in its own name if so authorized under the county charter.	TIA, WAM

When faxing, please indicate to which committee the testimony is being submitted and the date and time of the hearing.

**Please note: If you submit your written testimony after 4:30 p.m. the day prior to the hearing, please sign-in at the staff table to testify orally. A copy of your testimony may not be available during the hearing but will be posted online for the public after the hearing.**
