<u>HB 191</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO AQUARIUM AQUATIC LIFE. Enhances the regulation of aquarium aquatic life collection in the State.	WLO, JUD, FIN
<u>HB 679</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO STATE PARKS. Exempts the state parks special fund from the 5% central service expenses fee.	WLO, FIN
<u>HB 680</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO TOURISM. Authorizes the use of the state parks special fund to pay the debt service on revenue bonds that may be issued for the construction, repair, replacement, additions, and extensions of state park facilities.	WLO, FIN
<u>HB 951</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO LANDOWNER LIABILITY Relieves landowner of liability for any damage, injury, or harm to persons or property outside the boundaries of the landowner's land caused by naturally occurring land failure originating on unimproved land.	WLO, JUD
<u>HB 1002</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO ZONING. Requires each county to enact zoning ordinances to protect against land slides and rock slides.	WLO, JUD
<u>HB 570</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO COASTAL ZONE MANAGEMENT Requires certain agencies to account for sea-level rise and minimize risk from coastal hazards such as erosion, storm inundation, hurricanes, and tsunamis. Preserves public shoreline access. Extends shoreline setback to no less than 40 ft. from shoreline and authorizes counties to account for annual erosion rates.	WLO



<u>HB 47</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO PUBLIC LANDS. Requires department of land and natural resources to notify an existing lessee of public lands of its intent to dispose of the lands in a subsequent transaction not less than 120 days prior to the expiration of the existing lease term.	WLO
<u>HB 595</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE ENVIRONMENT Establishes June 8 of each year as World Ocean Day to celebrate the blessings of the oceans, improve international relations, and increase public awareness of conservation management of the ocean environment.	WLO
<u>HB 366</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO MANTA RAYS. Creates administrative penalties for any person who knowingly captures or kills a manta ray within state marine waters.	WLO, JUD

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

- The date and time of the hearing;
- Measure number; and
- The number of copies the Committee is requesting.
