<u>HB 791</u> <u>(HSCR200)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO COUNTIES. Renders void as against public policy any county ordinance that prohibits a group living facility for the elderly and persons with disabilities from being located within any specified distance from another group living facility.	HUS, WLO
<u>HB 865</u> <u>(HSCR390)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION. Requires the Statewide Transportation Council to comply with county transportation and general plans, to the extent it does not impact federal funds, in the preparation of the statewide transportation plan for projected transportation needs for a six-year period.	TRN, WLO
<u>HB 1165</u> <u>(HSCR557)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO HARBORS. Authorizes the Department of Transportation to adopt rules relating to safety measures, security requirements, and shipping activities for the purpose of protecting and ensuring the general public interest and safety of persons and vessels in the commercial harbors belonging to or controlled by the State.	TRN, WLO
<u>HB 1554</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO HAWAII COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY. Allows Chairperson of DHHL and director of city and county department of planning and permitting to designate a representative to serve on HCDA.	WLO
<u>HB 921</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO PUBLIC LANDS. Allows 999-year homestead leases to be assigned to land trusts that are created for purposes of managing and holding the homestead leasehold estate for the benefit of the lessee and lessee's family members.	WLO



<u>HB 520</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO BUILDINGS. Repeals the amendments made by Act 228, Session Laws of Hawaii 2008, which require the taking of photographs of actual or potential historic buildings before demolition, construction, or alteration of the buildings.	WLO
<u>HCR 66</u> <u>Status</u>	URGING THE USE OF POLYVINYL CHLORIDE AND HIGH-DENSITY POLYETHYLENE PIPE AND FITTINGS FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OR REPAIR OF PRIVATE AND PUBLIC POTABLE WATER SYSTEMS.	WLO, FIN
<u>HR 52</u> <u>Status</u>	URGING THE USE OF POLYVINYL CHLORIDE AND HIGH-DENSITY POLYETHYLENE PIPE AND FITTINGS FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OR REPAIR OF PRIVATE AND PUBLIC POTABLE WATER SYSTEMS.	WLO, FIN
