SB 1265 Testimony Status	RELATING TO LABELING OF MEAT AND FISH PRODUCTS. Requires truthful labeling of meat and fish that has been gas-treated.	WTL, CPN
SB 1116 Testimony Status	RELATING TO AGRICULTURE. Establishes an organic agriculture task force under the direction of department of agriculture to develop a business plan for a Hawaii organic food center; makes an appropriation to the task force to carry out its purposes.	WTL, WAM
SB 1345 Testimony Status	RELATING TO AGRICULTURE. Provides for fair compensation, including an automatic lease extension, when leased public land for agricultural or pastoral uses is withdrawn, condemned, or taken for public purposes.	WTL, WAM
SB 995 Testimony Status	RELATING TO THE OFFICE OF HAWAIIAN AFFAIRS. Amends the law to provide for the office of Hawaiian affairs to receive a portion of the income and proceeds from land in the public land trust.	WTL, WAM
