Madam:

Your Committee on Health, to which was referred S.B. No. 933 entitled:

"A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO TEMPORARY LICENSURE OF DENTISTS,"

begs leave to report as follows:

The purpose of this measure is to allow for the temporary licensure of dentists who are employed by or under contract to the Department of Health.

Your Committee received testimony in support of this measure from the Department of Health and Board of Dental Examiners. Testimony in opposition was received from the Hawaii Dental Association and one individual. Written testimony presented to the Committee may be reviewed on the Legislature's website.

Your Committee finds that the recruitment of dentists to work for the Department of Health is generally limited to individuals who maintain active licenses in Hawaii to practice dentistry. This measure allows for an expansion of the potential pool to include dentists who hold a temporary license.

Your Committee further finds that the employment of temporarily licensed dentists by the Department of Health is necessary to address the critical shortage of dentists in areas of the State largely remote and rural, particularly on the neighbor islands and other disadvantaged communities. This measure also serves to expand the number of dentists who serve persons with disabilities, with mental illness, and the aging population.

Your Committee has amended this measure on the recommendation of the Hawaii Dental Association to:

- (1) Clarify that the Board of Dental Examiners may issue a community service license to practice dentistry while the person is in the employment of the Department of Health;
- (2) Clarify that the Board of Dental Examiners may issue a temporary license to practice dentistry while the person is contracted by the Department of Health to conduct dental education and training; and
- (3) Deleting the provision in current law that provides for temporary dental licensure of dentists who serve Hansen's disease sufferers, as being unnecessary for purposes of the amended measure.

Your Committee notes that, for purposes of the title of this measure, the community service license is a different sort of dental license than the temporary dental license, however the community service license is essentially temporary in nature since it is renewable biennially and authorizes practice under restricted time limits.

As affirmed by the record of votes of the members of your Committee on Health that is attached to this report, your Committee is in accord with the intent and purpose of S.B. No. 933, as amended herein, and recommends that it pass Second Reading in the form attached hereto as S.B. No. 933, S.D. 1, and be referred to the Committee on Commerce and Consumer Protection.

Description:

Clarifies that the board of dental examiners may issue a community service license to practice dentistry while the person is in the employment of the department of health. Clarifies that the board of dental examiners may issue a temporary license to practice dentistry while the person is contracted by the department of health to conduct dental education and training. (SD1)

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TEMPORARY LICENSURE OF DENTISTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 448-9.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended as follows: 2 3 1. By amending subsection (a) to read: 4 "(a) The board of dental examiners may issue, without 5 examination, a community service license to practice dentistry 6 in the employment of the department of health, of a federally 7 qualified health center, Native Hawaiian health systems center, 8 or post-secondary dental auxiliary training program accredited 9 by the American Dental Association Commission on Dental Accreditation. Community service licensees under this section **10** 11 shall abide by the requirements and conditions placed upon those **12** fully licensed under this chapter. 13 Eligible candidates shall: 14 Provide copies of documentation and credentials that 15 include but are not limited to: 16 (A) A diploma or certificate of graduation from a 17 dental college accredited by the American Dental

- 1 **Department's Position:** The Department strongly supports this Administration-sponsored measure.
- 2 **Fiscal Implications:** None.
- Purpose and Justification: The purpose of this proposal is to amend Sections 448-9.6 (a)(e) and 448-
- 4 12 (a)(b), Hawaii Revised Statutes, to allow for the community service licensure of dentists who are
- 5 employed by the Department of Health and amends the temporary dentistry licensure statutes as they
- 6 apply to the Department of Health. SD1 represents a shift in language from the original proposal and
- 7 was arrived at through discussion with the Hawaii Dental Association and in consideration of testimony
- submitted by the Hawaii State Board of Dental Examiners. The Department shares the concerns of the
- 9 Legislature and the community over limited access to basic dental care, particularly among persons with
- disabilities. With the amendments proposed in SD1, the Department anticipates that we will be able to
- create additional training opportunities to enhance access to dental care for disabled persons. We also
- anticipate being able to recruit additional dental care providers licensed in other states who are willing to
- work in Hawaii in response to the needs of our disabled communities. Given the opportunities this
- proposal creates for the Department to help assure access to needed basic dental care among our most
- vulnerable populations, we strongly support this proposal.

WRITTEN COMMENTS ON SENATE BILL NO. 933, S.D.1, RELATING TO TEMPORARY LICENSURE OF DENTISTS.

TO THE HONORABLE ROSALYN H. BAKER, CHAIR, AND MEMBERS OF THE COMMITTEE:

My name is Jeffrey Miyazawa, D.D.S., Chair of the Board of Dental Examiners ("Board"). The Board supports the intent of S.B. No. 933, S.D.1, to provide for a means of licensure to practice dentistry while in the employment of or under contract with the Department of Health.

The purpose of S.B. No. 933, S.D.1 is to provide a temporary license to practice dentistry to dentists who are under contract with the Department of Health to conduct dental education and training. The bill also clarifies that a community service license to practice dentistry may be issued to a person employed by the Department of Health. The Board understands that there is a need for dental care services for residents in underserved communities or populations statewide, particularly to persons with disabilities, persons with mental illness, and the aging population. There is also a need to educate and train dentists to treat these populations. Given ongoing, unmet oral health needs in many communities or populations, the Department of Health would be able to increase its dental services and ensure access to basic dental care.
