- 1 Department's Position: DOH supports this resolution and agrees that it is appropriate for the
- 2 Department to work with the Honolulu Police Department and the City.
- 3 Fiscal Implications: None.
- 4 Purpose and Justification: This resolution requests that the Department of Health, Clean Water
- 5 Branch and Solid and Hazardous Waste Branch, the Honolulu Police Department, and the City and
- 6 County of Honolulu, Department of Environmental Services and Department of Planning and Permitting
- 7 jointly investigate and enforce applicable regulations including the alleged illegal structures and illegal
- 8 dumping activities.
- We agree that a combined effort with the Honolulu Police Department and the City and County
- of Honolulu, Department of Environmental Services and Department of Planning and Permitting is
- 11 appropriate.
- The Department has already conducted two inspections of the area, one of which has resulted in
- one letter to a neighboring property owner requiring cleanup of the waste they left at the end of
- Laumaile Street. Since Laumaile Street is a private roadway, we will also be asking the owner of the

roadway to ensure that any accumulated waste is properly disposed of. Similar actions will be ĺ conducted for the neighboring Kalihi Stream. Thank you for the opportunity to testify on this measure.
