H.B. NO. 1280

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PROCUREMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature find that the system of 2 awarding of contracts for public construction under chapter 103, Hawaii Revised Statutes, and for public procurement purchases 3 4 under chapter 103D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, needs to be improved by requiring a thorough examination of a prospective 5 6 contractor's record of compliance with the state labor laws. The legislature is concerned that contractors who have a history 7 8 of violating state labor laws may gain an unfair advantage over 9 other contractors who comply with state labor laws in the bid 10 process.

11 The purpose of this Act is to enact the responsible12 construction contractor law.

13 SECTION 2. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by 14 adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read 15 as follows:

"CHAPTER

RESPONSIBLE CONSTRUCTION CONTRACTOR LAW



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§ -A Applicability. (a) This chapter shall apply to
public works contracts under chapter 103 and to procurements for
construction under chapter 103D, if the general contract amount
is \$100,000 or more and to any subcontract of \$25,000 or more in
connection with any general contract.

6 This chapter shall not apply to employees covered by a (b) 7 collective bargaining agreement under chapter 89 if the applicability of this chapter is expressly waived in the 8 9 collective bargaining agreement in clear and unambiguous terms. 10 -B Definitions. As used in this chapter, the terms S "contract" and "contractor", shall have the same meaning as in 11 12 section 103D-104, as those terms apply to construction. The 13 term "construction" shall have the same meaning as in section 14 103D-104.

-C Prerequisites for award of contract. (a) A 15 S 16 contractor who submits a bid for a contract for construction shall show proof under subsection (c) to the comptroller or 17 county counterpart for contracts under chapter 103 or to the 18 19 procurement officer for contracts under chapter 103D, as a 20 prerequisite to being awarded a construction contract; provided 21 that this subsection shall be deemed to be a provision of any contract between the contractor and subcontractor. 22



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(b) A subcontractor who subcontracts with a contractor 1 2 under subsection (a), for a subcontract for construction shall show proof under subsection (c) to the comptroller or county 3 4 counterpart for contracts under chapter 103 or to the 5 procurement officer for contracts under chapter 103D, as a 6 prerequisite to being awarded a subcontract; provided that the 7 contractor shall be primarily responsible for presentation of the show of proof under this subsection; and provided further 8 9 that this subsection shall be incorporated by reference in any 10 contract between the contractor and subcontractor. A contractor or subcontractor, as applicable, shall 11 (C) 12 comply with the following prerequisites: 13 Maintain and participate in a bona fide apprenticeship (1)14 program under chapter 372, with regards to each trade 15 or occupation fitting for apprenticeship that: 16 (A) Is involved in the particular construction 17 project; (B) Is approved by the department of labor and 18 19 industrial relations; and 20 (C)Abides by journeyman ratio for each trade as 21 required for the performance of the contract.



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1	(2)	Comply with the requirements under section 104-2 with
2		regard to prevailing wages;
3	(3)	Furnish, at the expense of the contractor or
4		subcontractor, as applicable, insurance for
5		hospitalization, medical, and prescription drug
6		benefits for all individuals employed on the project;
7	(4)	Maintain during the period of the contract or
8		subcontract, as applicable, workers' compensation
9		insurance under chapter 386 for all individuals
10		employed on the project;
11	(5)	Commit to hiring Hawaii residents to compose not less
12		than eighty per cent of the workforce on the project;
13		provided that the department of labor and industrial
14		relations shall determine those trades in a shortage
15		category in this State, in which case this paragraph
16		shall not apply to shortage category trades; and
17		provided further that those firms that satisfy this
18		paragraph shall be entitled to an adjustment in the
19		bid amount by subtracting thereto per cent;
20	(6)	Provide its employees with a fair and neutral process
21		for resolving work-related issues, not including



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1		forcing the employee to waive statutory remedies and	
2		rights; and	
3	(7)	Be appropriately licensed.	
4	S	-D Compliance duration; compliance officer. Each	
5	contractor and subcontractor shall:		
6	(1)	Comply with section -C for the entire duration of	
7		the contract of construction; and	
8	(2)	Certify compliance with section -C, under oath, by	
9		an officer of the contractor and subcontractor, to the	
10		comptroller, or county counterpart, or procurement	
11		officer, as applicable, on a monthly basis.	
12	ş	-E Failure to comply; sanctions. A contractor or	
13	subcontractor under this chapter who fails to comply with		
14	section	-C, shall be subject to any of the following	
15	sanctions:		
16	(1)	Temporary suspension of work on the project until	
17		there is compliance;	
18	(2)	Withholding of payment on the contract or subcontract,	
19		as applicable, until there is compliance;	
20	(3)	Permanent disqualification from any further work on	
21		the project;	



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1	(4)	Recovery by the State or county, as applicable, of any
2		moneys expended on the contract or subcontract, as
3		applicable; and
4	(5)	Proceedings for debarment or suspension under section
5		103D-702."
6	SECT	ION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
7	matured,	penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
8	begun, be	fore its effective date.
9	SECT	ION 4. In codifying this Act, the revisor shall
10	substitut	e appropriate section numbers for the letters used in
11	section 2	of this Act.
12	SECT	ION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
