## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE CIVIL DEFENSE AND EMERGENCY ACT.

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:**

1           SECTION 1. Section 128-19, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is  
2 amended to read as follows:  
3           "**§128-19 Immunity from liability of private shelter.** Any  
4 individual, partnership, firm, society, unincorporated  
5 association, joint venture group, hui, joint stock company,  
6 corporation, trustee, personal representative, trust estate,  
7 decedent's estate, trust, or other legal entity whether doing  
8 business for itself or in a fiduciary capacity, owning or  
9 controlling real property, who voluntarily and without  
10 compensation grants a license or privilege for, or otherwise  
11 permits, the designation by the director of civil defense for  
12 the use of the whole or any part of the property for the purpose  
13 of sheltering persons during an actual, impending, mock or  
14 practice attack, natural disaster or man-made disaster shall,  
15 together with its successors in interest, if any, not be civilly  
16 liable for negligently causing the death of or injury to any  
17 person or damage to any personal property on the property of the  
18 licensor in connection with the use of the licensed premises for



1 the purposes designated. For purposes of this section, the  
2 consideration paid by any guest or person for transient  
3 accommodation lodging shall not be considered compensation."

4 SECTION 2. New statutory material is underscored.

5 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
