HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A WORKING GROUP TO DEVELOP A COMPREHENSIVE PLAN TO IMPROVE AWARENESS OF AND STRENGTHEN SUPPORT FOR PERSONS WITH DYSLEXIA.

1 WHEREAS, dyslexia is a learning disability that is 2 neurobiological in origin and characterized by difficulties with 3 accurate and fluent word recognition, poor spelling, and poor 4 decoding abilities, resulting in problems with reading 5 comprehension and reduced reading experience that impede the 6 growth of vocabulary and background knowledge; and 7

8 WHEREAS, students with dyslexia may experience difficulties 9 in skills such as reading, spelling, writing, and speaking; and 10

11 WHEREAS, between ten and twenty per cent of Americans are 12 affected by dyslexia or other reading disabilities; and 13

14 WHEREAS, a significant number of students in Hawaii, including those with dyslexia, read below basic reading levels 15 and experience literacy challenges, which include difficulties 16 with language (spoken or written) or reading (in phonemic 17 awareness, phonics, vocabulary, fluency, or comprehension), or 18 difficulties with one or more of the basic neurobiological or 19 psychological processes involved in understanding or using 20 language (spoken or written) that may manifest itself in an 21 imperfect ability to listen, think, speak, read, write, spell, 22 or perform mathematical calculations; and 23 24

25 WHEREAS, an improved awareness of and support for persons with dyslexia and improved training of educators (including 26 teachers, education administrators, education officials, and 27 other employees providing instruction, assessment, or special 28 services for general, compensatory, gifted, or special 29 30 education; therapy; and training of students under the jurisdiction of the Department of Education) will help students, 31 including those with dyslexia, obtain the necessary instruction, 32



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support, skills, and resources to increase their success in 1 2 school; now, therefore, 3 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 4 Twenty-fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 5 of 2010, the Senate concurring, that the Department of Education 6 7 and the University of Hawaii are requested to establish a working group to develop a comprehensive policy to improve 8 awareness of and strengthen support for persons with dyslexia; 9 and 10 11 12 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is requested to develop a comprehensive plan to make training available to 13 educators in the State by the 2011-2012 school year, where 14 training includes technical assistance and training in the early 15 identification and assessment of dyslexia, and on the direct, 16 explicit, and systematic research-based instruction of students 17 18 in oral and written language; and 19 20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the comprehensive plan to make training available to educators in the State is requested to 21 include but not be limited to the following areas: 22 23 24 (1)Increasing awareness of dyslexia; 25 (2) Early assessment and identification of students with 26 literacy challenges, including dyslexia; 27 28 (3) A tiered continuum of intensity for research-based 29 instructional intervention within the Response to 30 Intervention model: 31 32 (4) Evidence-based progress monitoring that provides 33 students, parents, and educators with data on student 34 performance and improvements, and that uses this data 35 in evaluations and decisions for instructional 36 37 changes; 38 Research-based interventions to address the needs of 39 (5) students with literacy challenges, including dyslexia, 40 consistent with quidelines established by the 41 Partnership For Reading, comprising the National 42 Institute of Child Health and Human Development, the 43 National Institute for Literacy, and the United States 44
