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## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION TO CREATE A MOPED  
TASK FORCE TO EXPLORE THE FEASIBILITY OF CLASSIFYING MOPEDS  
LIKE MOTORCYCLES IN CERTAIN INSTANCES.

1           WHEREAS, as the economic downturn continues to affect many  
2 state residents are looking at ways they can reduce their  
3 monthly expenses; and  
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5           WHEREAS, one way people are seeking to reduce their  
6 expenses is by reducing their daily transportation costs; and  
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8           WHEREAS, residents are increasingly turning to mopeds as  
9 their means of transportation because of their high miles per  
10 gallon fuel use and low maintenance costs; and  
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12           WHEREAS, moped registrations in the State of Hawaii  
13 continue to rise and are now over 23,000; and  
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15           WHEREAS, currently in the State no special education or  
16 training is required to obtain a license that would allow you to  
17 operate a moped; and  
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19           WHEREAS, as a result of these increased registrations and  
20 no special training moped related accidents and fatalities  
21 continue to rise; and  
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23           WHEREAS, amending the way mopeds are classified and handled  
24 within the Hawaii Revised Statutes to treat them more like  
25 motorcycles and less like bicycles could drastically reduce the  
26 amount of accidents and deaths in the state as well as improve  
27 the quality of life of all citizens by reducing the amount of  
28 illegally retrofitted mopeds that are often loud and disturbing;  
29 now, therefore,  
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1 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the  
 2 Twenty-fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session  
 3 of 2010, the Senate concurring, that a task force on mopeds be  
 4 created within the Department of Transportation to explore the  
 5 feasibility of treating mopeds more like motorcycles; and  
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
7 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the moped taskforce shall meet  
 8 a minimum of five times between June 1, 2010, and December 31,  
 9 2010. The task force may continue to meet beyond December 31,  
 10 2010, if necessary. The Department of Transportation shall  
 11 provide administrative support to the illegal fireworks task  
 12 force, and  
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14 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED the task force shall consist of the  
 15 Director of transportation Services or his designee; who shall  
 16 serve as the chairperson, a representative from each of the four  
 17 counties' transportation departments, a member of the moped  
 18 industry; as selected by industry members, the Attorney General  
 19 or his designee, a representative from each of the four  
 20 counties' police department, and a representative from the  
 21 Department of Motor Vehicles Budget and Finance office, and

23 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the moped task force shall  
 24 submit a preliminary plan and strategy report to the legislature  
 25 no later than January 10, 2011, and  
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27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this  
 28 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, the Mayor  
 29 of the City and County of Honolulu, the Mayor of the County of  
 30 Hawaii, the Mayor of the County of Maui, and the Mayor of the  
 31 County of Kauai.  
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
