HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING MEMBERS OF HAWAII'S CONGRESSIONAL DELEGATION TO SUPPORT H.R. 208, THE NATIONAL GUARDSMEN AND RESERVISTS PARITY FOR PATRIOTS ACT, AND S. 644, THE NATIONAL GUARD AND RESERVE RETIRED PAY EQUITY ACT OF 2009.

1 WHEREAS, when the Reserve and National Guard Retirement Pay 2 System was established in 1948, members of the National Guard 3 and Active Reserve were presumed to have full-time civilian 4 careers subject to extended military service only in the 5 unlikely event of a national mobilization; and

7 WHEREAS, this retirement system was intended to supplement 8 a normal civilian career promotion and retirement program; and 9

10 WHEREAS, Since September 11, 2001, approximately seven 11 hundred thousand members of the National Guard and Active 12 Reserve have been activated for military duty, including nearly 13 two hundred thousand who have been deployed for duty more than 14 once; and

16 WHEREAS, reserve mission increases and a smaller force 17 structure mean that guard members and reservists are devoting a 18 far greater share of their civilian working lives to military 19 service than originally envisioned by the creators of the and 20 National Guard Retirement Pay System; and

22 WHEREAS, many of these service members now are being mobi-23 lized one year out of every three, and this dramatically changes 24 the working and income situations for these guard members and 25 reservists and their employers and families; and

WHEREAS, frequent activations remove guard members and
reservists from their civilian careers, often costing them
promotions and sometimes their jobs, which directly reduces
their civilian retirement pay; and



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2 WHEREAS, the government has an obligation to help offset 3 these service-imposed losses by updating the reserve retirement 4 system to reflect realities of today's service in the National 5 Guard or Reserve; and

7 WHEREAS, The National Defense Authorization Act of 2008 took a first step by reducing the reserve retirement age from 8 9 age sixty by three months for every ninety days of active duty performed since January 28, 2008; however, it provided no credit 10 for the hundreds of thousands of service members who were called 11 up for duty between September 11, 2001, and January 28, 2005, 12 during the height of deployments to missions in Iraq and 13 14 Afghanistan; and

16 WHEREAS, H.R. 208, the National Guardsmen and Reservists 17 Parity for Patriots Act, and S. 644, the National Guard and 18 Reserve Retired Pay Equity Act of 2009, would make the 2008 19 change retroactive to September 11, 2001; now therefore, 20

21 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 22 of 2010, the Senate concurring, that the members of Hawaii's 23 congressional delegation are urged to support H.R. 208, the 24 25 National Guardsmen and Reservists Parity for Patriots Act, and S. 644, the National Guard and Reserve Retired Pay Equity Act of 26 27 2009, which would include service after September 11, 2001, as service qualifying for the determination of a reduced 28 eligibility age for receipt of non-regular service retired pay 29 for members of the National Guard and Active Reserve; and 30 31

32 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 33 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the members of Hawaii's 34 congressional delegation.

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
