
HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

SUPPORTING VOTER CAMPAIGNS AND POLITICAL FORUMS FOR THE
CANDIDATES SEEKING POLITICAL OFFICE, INCLUDING SEATS ON THE
OFFICE OF HAWAIIAN AFFAIRS BOARD OF TRUSTEES.

1 WHEREAS, Prince Jonah Kuhio Kalanianaʻole believed it
2 important that the native Hawaiian community be informed and
3 active in civic and political issues; and
4

5 WHEREAS, as a result, the Hawaiian Civic Club of Honolulu
6 was founded in 1918; today, 58 civic clubs are located
7 throughout Hawaii and in Alaska, California, Colorado, Illinois,
8 Nevada, Utah, Virginia, Washington, and Tennessee; and
9

10 WHEREAS, the Association of Hawaiian Civic Clubs advocates
11 for the improved welfare of native Hawaiians in culture, health,
12 economic development, education, housing, social welfare, and
13 nationhood; and
14

15 WHEREAS, people in leadership positions impact decisions on
16 issues of importance to the native Hawaiian community; and
17

18 WHEREAS, political forums have helped voters to better
19 understand the issues and the stance of each candidate; this
20 enables voters to make sound, informed decisions when they cast
21 their vote; and
22

23 WHEREAS, statistics show that more than 153,000 native
24 Hawaiians are eligible to vote, representing about 16 percent of
25 the voter population, and it is critical that their voice be
26 heard; and
27

28 WHEREAS, efforts by the Office of Hawaiian Affairs (OHA)
29 and OHA's candidate forums, the Association of Hawaiian Civic
30 Clubs' voter registration drive, the Ilioulaokalani Coalition's
31 "No Vote, No Grumble" campaign, and the Council for Native

1 Hawaiian Advancement's "Native Votes Count" campaign
2 significantly improved native Hawaiian participation in the last
3 election; now, therefore,
4

5 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the
6 Twenty-fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session
7 of 2010, the Senate concurring, that the Legislature supports
8 voter campaigns and political forums for the candidates seeking
9 political office, including seats on the OHA Board of Trustees;
10 and
11

12 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Association of Hawaiian
13 Civic Clubs is requested to host or participate in political
14 discussion forums of candidates regarding political, cultural,
15 and social issues of importance to the native Hawaiian
16 community; and
17

18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that civic clubs, schools, and other
19 Hawaiian organizations and their members promote voter
20 registration and participate in voter registration campaigns and
21 drives; and
22

23 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that OHA, the Department of Hawaiian
24 Home Lands, Kamehameha Schools, Council for Native Hawaiian
25 Advancement, community foundations, and other organizations be
26 encouraged to fund these initiatives that support educational
27 and political forums, and native Hawaiian voter turnout; and

29 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
30 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Chair of the Board
31 of OHA, President of the Association of Hawaiian Civic Clubs,
32 Chair of the Board of Trustees of Kamehameha Schools, President
33 of the Council for Native Hawaiian Advancement, Ilioulaokalani
34 Coalition, and Hawaiian Independence Action Alliance.
