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## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE BOARD OF EDUCATION TO CREATE POLICIES ALLOWING CHARTER SCHOOLS TO USE VACANT CLASSROOMS AND SCHOOLS THAT WILL BE CLOSED.

WHEREAS, the Board of Education has the power to formulate 1 2 statewide educational policy pursuant to section 302A-1101, 3 Hawaii Revised Statutes; and 4 5 WHEREAS, Act 14, Special Session Laws of Hawaii 2008, required the Department of Education to submit annual reports 6 7 identifying unused classrooms that would be suitable for 8 conversion into early learning facilities; and 9 10 WHEREAS, as stated in a December 2009 report by the 11 Department, eighty vacant classrooms have been identified as being available; and 12 13 14 WHEREAS, these classrooms are located in various public 15 elementary and middle schools on Oahu, Maui, Hawaii, and Kauai, 16 including Aliiolani School, Kalihi Kai School, Wahiawa Middle School, Waianae Intermediate School, Kailua Intermediate School, 17 18 Kapaa Middle School, Haiku School, and Keaau Middle School; and 19 20 WHEREAS, the report also indicates that it would cost 21 approximately \$7,204,000 to convert the eighty classrooms into 22 early learning facilities; and 23 WHEREAS, Hawaii Administrative Rules, Title 8, Chapter 38, 24 25 provides conditions, procedures, and guidelines for the 26 Department with respect to any efforts to consolidate schools; 27 and 28 29 WHEREAS, the Department has established task forces to analyze and research school consolidations on Hawaii, Maui, 30 31 Molokai, and Oahu, and has announced future plans to analyze and HCR38 HD1 EDN 02-17-10 GOV-R2(10)

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research school consolidations in five different areas on Oahu; 1 2 and 3 WHEREAS, the Board voted on May 1, 2009, to consolidate 4 5 Wailupe Valley School into Aina Haina School; and 6 7 WHEREAS, the facilities formerly used by Wailupe Valley School remain unused today; and 8 9 WHEREAS, schools that are closed due to consolidation are 10 at risk of being removed from the Department's authority; and 11 12 13 WHEREAS, there is an increased demand for charter school 14 education but a lack of facilities: there were over 2,800 15 students on waitlists who were unable to enroll in charter 16 schools for the 2008-2009 school year due to a lack of capacity in existing facilities, according to the Charter School 17 18 Administrative Office; and 19 20 WHEREAS, some charter schools do not have conventional 21 classrooms and must use tents, shipping containers, trailers, 22 and other makeshift structures as classrooms; and 23 24 WHEREAS, the need for charter school facilities is as important as the need for early learning facilities; and 25 26 WHEREAS, although some of the eighty vacant classrooms may 27 28 not be located in areas where early learning facilities are in 29 demand, they may be appropriate locations for charter schools; 30 and 31 32 WHEREAS, the cost of converting vacant classrooms into 33 charter school classrooms is likely to be less than the cost of 34 converting them into early learning facilities; now, therefore, 35 36 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 37 Twenty-fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2010, the Senate concurring, that the Board is requested to 38 39 develop policies to allot a portion of the existing eighty 40 vacant classrooms for use by charter schools; and 41 42 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board is requested to 43 develop policies that allow public schools that are closed to

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1	remain as facilities available for use by charter schools or for
2	other educational purposes; and
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4	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislature requests a
5	list of vacant classrooms and schools that have recently been
6	closed or are to be closed to be provided to the Twenty-fifth
7	Legislature before its adjournment on April 29, 2010; and
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9	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board submit a report
10	summarizing the aforementioned policies to the Legislature no
11	later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular
12	Session of 2011; and
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14	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
15	Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the
16	Board of Education, Superintendent of Education, and Executive
17	Director of the Charter School Administrative Office.
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
