HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE AUDITOR TO ASSESS THE EFFECTS OF REGULATING RESPIRATORY CARE PRACTITIONERS.

1	WHEREAS, the practice of respiratory care in the State

5	are the residents of the forty-eight other states, from the
6	unqualified practice of respiratory care and from unprofessional

9 10	WHEREAS, the practice of respiratory care is a dynamic and changing art and science which continues to evolve with more
10	sophisticated techniques and clinical modalities in patient

14	WHEREAS, section 26H-6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, requires
15	that new regulatory measures being considered for enactment
16	which, if enacted, would subject unregulated professions and
17 18	vocations to licensing or other regulatory controls, be referred to the Auditor for analysis; and
