A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS FOR THE BENEFIT OF THE
TWENTY-FOURTH SENATORIAL DISTRICT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The director of finance is authorized to issue
2 general obligation bonds in the sum of \$33,653,500 or so much
3 thereof as may be necessary, and the same sum, or so much
4 thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated for fiscal year
5 2009-2010, for the purpose of capital improvement projects for
6 the twenty-fourth senatorial district, as follows:

7 1. Aikahi elementary school

15 SECTION 2. The appropriation made for the capital
 16 improvement projects authorized by this Act shall not lapse at
 17 the end of the fiscal year for which the appropriation is made;
 18 provided that all moneys from the appropriation unencumbered as
 19 of June 30, 2012, shall lapse as of that date.

20 SECTION 3. The sums appropriated for the respective
 21 capital projects set forth in section 1 shall be expended by the



1 designated expending agency for the purposes of this Act as
2 follows:

3 (1) For items 1 through 19, the expending agency shall be
4 the department of education;

5 (2) For items 20 and 21, the expending agency shall be the
6 department of land and natural resources;


7 (3) For items 22 through 25, the expending agency shall be
8 the department of transportation; and

9 (4) For item 26, the expending agency shall be the
10 department of defense.

11 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2009.
