
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO GOVERNMENT SHARED SERVICES TECHNOLOGY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to establish the
2 shared services technology special fund, which will permit the
3 State of Hawaii to benefit from substantial cost savings when
4 implementing a statewide, centrally coordinated planning and
5 implementation process for common information technology
6 systems, hardware, and software across its many departments and
7 agencies.

8 Participating state departments and agencies shall
9 contribute to this fund to allow for "bulk purchases" and
10 coordinated multi-department and statewide contracts and
11 agreements to generate overall cost reductions from the
12 resulting economies of scale and decreased administrative
13 paperwork and processing time.

14 The department of accounting and general services,
15 information and communication services division, shall expend
16 these funds for the purpose of managing and administering shared
17 services that may include but are not limited to information



1 technology contracts, project and procurement management;
2 information technology planning, budget, and project management;
3 computer security administration; voice and data communication
4 services, software, hardware, infrastructure and support;
5 electronic messaging services; and data center and disaster
6 recovery facilities management and services.

7 SECTION 2. Chapter 36, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
8 by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to
9 read as follows:

10 "§36- Shared services technology special fund. (a)

11 There is established a shared services technology special fund,
12 within the state treasury, into which shall be deposited funds
13 from participating departments and agencies and other sources to
14 permit the State to benefit from cost savings when implementing
15 statewide information technology systems, hardware, and software
16 through a centrally coordinated planning, fund pooling, and
17 multi-department acquisition process.

18 The comptroller shall establish administrative procedures
19 to carry out the purposes of this section and expend the funds;
20 provided that:

- 21 (1) The purposes, for which any funds deposited into the
22 shared services technology special fund may be used,



1 shall be within the appropriate duties and
2 responsibilities of the department of accounting and
3 general services for information and technology
4 services; and

5 (2) The use of the funds shall be authorized by the
6 legislature prior to expenditure.

7 (b) The department of accounting and general services
8 shall submit a report to the legislature, no later than twenty
9 days prior to the convening of each regular session, beginning
10 with the regular session of 2010. The report shall include:

11 (1) The status of the shared services technology special
12 fund;

13 (2) A financial plan reflecting the means of generating
14 revenues to be deposited into the shared services
15 technology special fund;

16 (3) The amount of funds deposited into, and expended from,
17 the fund; and

18 (4) The purposes for which these amounts were expended."

19 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.

20 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2112.
