SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE RECOGNITION OF THE SECOND WEEK OF MARCH AS THE
"CENSUS IN SCHOOLS WEEK".

1 WHEREAS, the United States Constitution requires a count
2 every ten years of everyone residing in the United States
3 regardless of their nationality, citizenship status, race, age,
4 or gender; and

5
6 WHEREAS, census questionnaires will be delivered or mailed
7 to households via U.S. mail in March 2010 and Census Day is
8 April 1, 2010; and

9
10 WHEREAS, the goal is to count everyone in the State of
11 Hawaii, count them once and count them in the right place; and

12
13 WHEREAS, census data determines the number of seats each
14 state will have in the U.S. House of Representatives; and

15
16 WHEREAS, census data is used to determine boundaries for
17 state and local legislative and congressional districts; and

18
19 WHEREAS, 2010 Census data will affect how more than \$4
20 trillion will be allocated to local, state, and tribal
21 governments over the next ten years; and

22
23 WHEREAS, census data is used to determine funding for
24 schools, Title 1 programs, special education, college grant and
25 loan programs, public transportation, road and community
26 improvements; and

27
28 WHEREAS, the Census Bureau's program "2010 Census: It's
29 About Us", is a free education program which provides teachers
30 with lessons that meet core standards and feature skill building
31 activities in map literacy, graphing, and writing; and

1 WHEREAS, the "Census in Schools" program endeavors to reach
2 every public school, private school, charter school, home
3 school, student between kindergarten through 12th grade, school
4 administrator, teacher, household with school-age children and
5 educational organization; and

7 WHEREAS, children have been undercounted in every U.S.
8 census taken; and

9
10 WHEREAS, the program engages Hawaii's youth to help ensure
11 that every child and household member is counted; and

12
13 WHEREAS, this Census Bureau program challenges students to
14 get to know their communities and learn about their communities
15 needs; now, therefore,

16
17 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fifth
18 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2010, the
19 House of Representatives concurring, that the second week in
20 March, beginning with Sunday, be "Census in Schools" Week; and

21
22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislature supports the
23 "Census in Schools" program and recognizes the importance of
24 this program as a teaching tool for our children; and

25
26 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislature will work
27 toward encouraging residents to complete and mail back their
28 census questionnaires and to increase awareness regarding the
29 importance of the 2010 Census; and

31 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this body representing the
32 people of Hawaii gives the educational efforts of "Census in
33 Schools" its highest endorsement and encouragement; and

35 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
36 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor,
37 Chairperson of the Board of Education, the Superintendent of
38 Education, the Executive Director of the Hawaii Association of
