A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO COMMERCIAL DRIVER LICENSING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 286-240, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended by amending subsections (g) and (h) to read as follows:
3 "(g) The examiner of drivers shall disqualify any person
4 from driving a commercial motor vehicle for a period of not less
5 than [~~ninety~~] one hundred eighty days and not more than one year
6 for a first violation, or for at least [~~one-year~~] two years and
7 not more than five years for a second violation, or at least
8 three years and not more than five years for a third or
9 subsequent violation of a driver or vehicle out-of-service order
10 committed in a commercial motor vehicle transporting non-
11 hazardous materials arising from separate incidents occurring
12 within a ten-year period.
13 (h) The examiner of drivers shall disqualify any person
14 from driving a commercial motor vehicle for a period of not less
15 than one hundred eighty days [~~or~~] and not more than two years
16 for a first violation, or for at least three years and not more
17 than five years for any subsequent violation, of a driver or
18 vehicle out-of-service order committed in a commercial motor

1 vehicle transporting hazardous materials required to be
2 placarded under title 49 Code of Federal Regulations, part 172,
3 subpart F, or designed to transport sixteen or more occupants [7]
4 including the driver, arising from separate incidents occurring
5 within a ten-year period."

6 SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
7 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

8 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
