
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HAWAII HEALTH SYSTEMS CORPORATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. (a) There is established within the Hawaii
2 health systems corporation, a corporate transition management
3 team to be composed of the members of the Hawaii health systems
4 corporation's corporate finance and information systems and
5 audit committee.

6 (b) The corporate transition management team shall develop
7 a plan that includes:

8 (1) Providing for a general downsizing of Hawaii health
9 systems corporation's operations, including the
10 elimination of any expenses for lobbying;

11 (2) Determining what functions should remain with the
12 corporate division of the Hawaii health systems
13 corporation;

14 (3) Eliminating legal staff services from within the
15 Hawaii health systems corporation, and establishing
16 negotiations with local law firms to represent Hawaii
17 health systems corporation;



- 1 (4) Establishing negotiations with local accounting firms
- 2 to set up an accounting system for both corporate and
- 3 regional operations of the Hawaii health systems
- 4 corporation;
- 5 (5) Developing a functional and efficient electronic
- 6 medical records system;
- 7 (6) Establishing a new corporate board that includes the
- 8 Hawaii health systems corporation's regional chief
- 9 operating officers to manage the Hawaii health systems
- 10 corporation's corporate functions;
- 11 (7) Giving each regional system board human resources
- 12 functions; and
- 13 (8) Moving toward more regional control of the Hawaii
- 14 health systems corporation.

15 (c) The corporate transition management team shall submit
 16 the plan no later than twenty days prior to the start of the
 17 2010 regular session, including any suggested legislation.

18 SECTION 2. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
