
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS FOR THE BENEFIT OF THE
SIXTH REPRESENTATIVE DISTRICT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The following sums, or so much thereof as shall
2 be sufficient to finance the projects listed in this Act, are
3 hereby appropriated out of the general revenues of the State of
4 Hawaii for fiscal year 2009-2010.

5 1. To be expended by the department of accounting and general

7 (A) Innovations public charter school,	
8 Maui Grading of parking lot,

21 Avenue through White Sands Beach
22 Estates Subdivision

14 (B) La'aloa (YMCA) park, Hawaii
15 Development of ball fields on raw
16 land for community use consisting
17 of soccer, baseball, softball, and
18 similar outdoor field amenities

21 (C) Palani Road transmission
22 waterline, Hawaii



1 Construction of two concrete
 2 reservoirs and 12,500 feet of
 3 waterline running south of Palani
 4 Road in mostly private,
 5 undeveloped property that extends
 6 from Mamalahoa Highway to the
 7 Liliuokalani subdivision

8	Construction	\$14,000,000

10 (D) Queen Kaahumanu highway widening -
 11 Kealakehe to Keahole 16' W/L
 12 installation
 13 Installation of approximately
 14 25,000 linear feet waterline from
 15 Kealakehe parkway to Keahole
 16 reservoir, including typing into
 17 Hina Lani Street

18	Construction	\$ 3,750,000
19	Total funding	\$ 3,750,000

20 SECTION 2. The sums appropriated for the respective
 21 capital projects set forth in section 1 shall be expended by the
 22 designated expending agency for the purposes of this Act.



1 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2009.
