
A BILL FOR AN ACT

MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Kailua beach is that
2 part of the east shoreline of the island of Oahu between
3 Kawainui canal to the north and Alala point to the south, in the
4 Koolaupoko district. Kailua beach is subject to erosion related
5 to sand deficiencies at Kailua beach park, as well as future
6 impacts related to sea-level rise. Specifically, the southern
7 end of Kailua beach is subject to long-term erosion, which is
8 migrating northward with time.

9 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
10 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$100,000 or so much
11 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2009-2010 and the
12 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
13 2010-2011 for the University of Hawaii school of ocean and earth
14 science and technology to conduct a two-year study on
15 terminating, mitigating, and reversing beach erosion at Kailua
16 beach; provided that the school shall consult with federal,
17 state, and county agencies as necessary.



1 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the University
2 of Hawaii school of ocean and earth science and technology for
3 the purposes of this Act.

4 SECTION 3. The University of Hawaii school of ocean and
5 earth science and technology shall submit an interim report to
6 the legislature, the governor, and the mayor of the city and
7 county of Honolulu not later than twenty days prior to the
8 convening of the Regular Session of 2010. The report shall
9 include but not be limited to a discussion of short-term
10 measures that may be adopted in order to reduce and mitigate
11 beach erosion at Kailua beach.

12 SECTION 4. The University of Hawaii school of ocean and
13 earth science and technology shall submit a final report,
14 including recommendations and any necessary proposed
15 legislation, to the legislature, the governor, and the mayor of
16 the city and county of Honolulu not later than twenty days prior
17 to the convening of the Regular Session of 2011. The report
18 shall include but not be limited to a discussion of short-term
19 and long-term measures that may be adopted in order to reduce,
20 mitigate, and reverse beach erosion at Kailua beach.



