
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO DOMESTIC VIOLENCE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. (a) There is established in the department of
2 human services for administrative purposes a temporary domestic
3 violence task force. The task force shall discuss and seek
4 input on policy to address domestic violence in Hawaii.

5 (b) The task force shall consist of nine members as
6 follows:

7 (1) A member of the house of representatives appointed by
8 the speaker of the house of representatives;

9 (2) A member of the senate appointed by the president of
10 the senate;

11 (3) The director of human services or the director's
12 designee;

13 (4) The director of health or the director's designee;

14 (5) The superintendent of education or the
15 superintendent's designee;

16 (6) One representative of the family court; and

17 (7) Three members appointed by the governor from a list
18 submitted by the speaker of the house of



1 representatives and president of the senate, with each
 2 member representing a different organization with
 3 experience in domestic violence issues. The
 4 appointments shall not be subject to senate
 5 confirmation.

6 (c) Members of the task force shall serve without
 7 compensation and shall receive no reimbursement for expenses.

8 (d) All proceedings and records of the task force shall be
 9 exempt from chapter 92, Hawaii Revised Statutes.

10 (e) The task force shall submit a report of its findings
 11 and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the
 12 legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of
 13 the regular session of 2011.

14 (f) The task force shall cease to exist on June 30, 2011.

15 SECTION 2. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2010, and
 16 shall be repealed on June 30, 2011.
