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## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO GOVERNMENT.

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:**

1           SECTION 1. Section 29-14, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is  
2 amended to read as follows:  
3           "**§29-14 Boards, etc., may accept funds, comply with**  
4 **federal acts.** (a) Except as otherwise provided by law, any  
5 board, commission, department, or officer of the State may  
6 accept and receive on behalf of the State, and receipt for, any  
7 and all grants or allotments of federal-aid moneys made  
8 available to the State by or pursuant to an act of Congress, and  
9 enter into or make such plan, agreement, or other arrangement  
10 with the agency designated by the act of Congress as is  
11 necessary to carry out the purposes of the Act; provided that if  
12 as a condition to receiving the federal-aid moneys it is  
13 necessary to match all or any part of the grant or allotment  
14 with state moneys, no plan, agreement, or arrangement may be  
15 entered into unless the board, commission, department, or  
16 officer has under its or the officer's control, moneys which may  
17 be expended lawfully for the purpose[-]; and provided further  
18 that the board, commission, department, or officer of the State



1 shall notify the president of the senate and the speaker of the  
2 house of representatives in writing no later than ten days  
3 following receipt of any grant or allotment of federal-aid  
4 moneys.

5 (b) The governor may transfer funds from the department of  
6 health to the department of human services and from the  
7 department of human services to the department of labor and  
8 industrial relations to obtain additional federal funds for  
9 medical assistance under Title XIX of the Social Security Act,  
10 as amended, and the work incentive program. The governor may  
11 also transfer funds from one department to another for the  
12 purpose of obtaining federal matching grants and allotments;  
13 provided that the state moneys have been appropriated for the  
14 purpose for which federal grants and allotments may be  
15 obtained."

16 SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed  
17 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

18 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
