# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO VETERAN BURIAL GRANTS.

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:**

1           SECTION 1. The legislature finds that a Filipino veteran  
2 of the New Filipino Scouts who enlisted between October 6, 1945,  
3 and June 30, 1947, who died after June 30, 2004, and who was, at  
4 the time of the veteran's death, a United States citizen and a  
5 resident of the State of Hawaii, is presently entitled to  
6 receive a burial grant from the office of veterans' services to  
7 pay for the cost of:

8           (1) Funeral and burial services for the deceased veteran;  
9           and

10          (2) Transporting the remains of the deceased veteran to  
11           the Philippines.

12          To qualify for this burial grant, however, the Filipino  
13 veteran's survivor or an interested party must produce an  
14 itemized paid invoice showing that the specific services were  
15 rendered. However, because of the tremendous upfront costs  
16 associated with funeral and burial services as well as  
17 transportation to the Philippines, some World War II Filipino  
18 veterans, and their families and friends, cannot afford to pay



1 for these activities in advance. Consequently, they will not be  
2 able to qualify for these burial grants from the office of  
3 veterans' services.

4 This Act requires the office of veterans' services to  
5 provide an alternative to the procedures currently specified in  
6 the rules of the office of veterans' services, which only apply  
7 in situations where a deceased Filipino veteran's survivor or an  
8 interested party has already paid for services rendered on  
9 behalf of the deceased veteran, or in situations where the  
10 deceased veteran may have purchased a pre-paid funeral and  
11 burial plan.

12 The purpose of this Act is to provide payment of up to \$  
13 per veteran, under the veterans' burial grant program, directly  
14 to a mortuary or crematory to:

- 15 (1) Provide funeral and burial services at the request of  
16 a qualifying deceased Filipino veteran's survivor or  
17 an interested party; and  
18 (2) Transport the veteran's remains to the Philippines,  
19 upon the submission of a contract for services.

20 SECTION 2. Chapter 363, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is  
21 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated  
22 and to read as follows:



1           "§363-        Disbursement of World War II Filipino veterans  
2 burial grant funds.   (a) At the request of a deceased Filipino  
3 veteran's survivor or an interested party, the office shall  
4 receive, review, and, as appropriate, approve requests for  
5 payments to:

6           (1) Provide funeral and burial services for a New Filipino  
7           Scout who died after June 30, 2004; and

8           (2) Transport the remains of that New Filipino Scout to  
9           the Philippines.

10          (b) The office shall establish the amount of burial grant  
11 funds that may be disbursed on behalf of a New Filipino Scout;  
12 provided that the amount shall not exceed \$       per person.

13          (c) The office shall not expend more than the amount  
14 appropriated for the fiscal year to provide burial grants for  
15 deceased World War II Filipino veterans.

16          (d) The office shall establish specific eligibility  
17 criteria, application and appeal procedures, service choices,  
18 and invoicing arrangements.

19          (e) The office shall authorize payment upon the submission  
20 of a paid and itemized invoice or invoices reflecting funeral  
21 and burial services and transportation of remains; provided that



1 these services were performed satisfactorily on behalf of a New  
2 Filipino Scout.

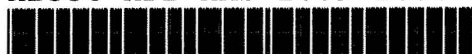
3 (f) As used in this section, "New Filipino Scout" means a  
4 Filipino veteran who served during World War II, enlisted in the  
5 New Filipino Scouts between October 6, 1945, and June 30, 1947,  
6 and who, at the time of the veteran's death, was a United States  
7 citizen and a resident of Hawaii."

8 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general  
9 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much  
10 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2009-2010 and the  
11 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year  
12 2010-2011 for burial grant funds for deceased Filipino veterans.

13 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department  
14 of defense, office of veterans' services, for the purposes of  
15 this Act.

16 SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.

17 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020.
