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## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TRAFFIC COURT RECORDS.

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:**

1           SECTION 1. Section 287-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is  
2 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:

3           "**§287-3 Furnishing of operating records.** [~~(a) The~~  
4 ~~traffic violations bureaus of the district courts, upon request,~~  
5 ~~shall furnish any person a certified abstract of the bureaus'~~  
6 ~~record, if any, of any person relating to all alleged moving~~  
7 ~~violations and any convictions resulting therefrom, arising from~~  
8 ~~the operation of a motor vehicle and any administrative license~~  
9 ~~revocation pursuant to chapter 291E, part III and chapter 286,~~  
10 ~~part XIV, as it was in effect on or before December 31, 2001.~~  
11 ~~The traffic violations bureaus may collect a fee, not to exceed~~  
12 ~~\$7, of which \$5 shall be deposited into the general fund and \$2~~  
13 ~~shall be deposited into the judiciary computer system special~~  
14 ~~fund.]~~

15           (a) The traffic violations bureaus of the district courts,  
16 upon request submitted via the judiciary website or in any other  
17 manner prescribed by the judiciary, shall:



- 1       (1) Furnish any person a certified abstract of the  
2       bureaus' record, if any, of any person relating to all  
3       alleged moving violations and any convictions  
4       resulting therefrom, arising from the operation of a  
5       motor vehicle and any administrative license  
6       revocation pursuant to chapter 291E, part III and  
7       chapter 286, part XIV, as it was in effect on or  
8       before December 31, 2001. The traffic violations  
9       bureaus may collect a fee, not to exceed \$7, of which  
10       \$5 shall be deposited into the general fund and \$2  
11       shall be deposited into the judiciary computer system  
12       special fund; and
- 13       (2) Furnish a certified traffic court report, if any, to  
14       the individual specified in the report. The report  
15       shall include case record history such as equipment  
16       and parking citations, in addition to the information  
17       specified in subsection (a)(1). The judiciary may  
18       collect a fee for the reports and require verification  
19       of the requestor's identity prior to releasing the  
20       report."

21       SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed  
22       and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

Judiciary; Online Requests for Traffic Abstracts and Traffic Court Reports

**Description:**

Permits online requests of traffic abstracts and traffic court reports. Authorizes judiciary to impose a fee and require verification of identity before releasing reports.
